

CITY ORDINANCE
ORDINANCE NO. 0-94-2

An Ordinance approving a water sale contract between the City of Arkadelphia, Arkansas and the Clark County River Valley Public Water Facilities Board; declaring an emergency; and for other purposes.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE CITY OF ARKADELPHIA, ARKANSAS.

WHEREAS, the City of Arkadelphia, Arkansas, owns and operates a water supply distribution system with a capacity currently capable of serving the present customer of the City of Arkadelphia and the estimated number of water users to be served by the Clark County River Valley Public Water Facilities Board, as shown in the plans of the system now on file in the office of the Clark County River Valley Public Water Facilities Board and furnished to the City of Arkadelphia, Arkansas, and

WHEREAS, the Clark County River Valley Public Water Facilities Board desires to purchase water from the City of Arkadelphia, Arkansas under the terms and conditions of a form contract attached hereto, therefore

SECTION 1. The sale of water, not to exceed five million gallons per month to the Clark County River Valley Public Water Facilities Board at a cost as set forth in Ordinance No. B-362 plus an additional 25% charge, which water rates may be amended by the City of Arkadelphia from time to time, is hereby approved under the terms and conditions as set forth in the water purchase contract, a form copy of which is attached hereto.

SECTION 2. Steve Beck, City Manager, and Shirley Loy, City Clerk, are hereby authorized to execute the water purchase contract with the Clark County River Valley Public Water Facilities Board.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. In order for the purchaser to secure sufficient and adequate financing for the water distribution system to be built by the Clark County River Valley Public Water Facilities Board, it is necessary that this water purchase contract be approved immediately and without delay or the funds may be lost and not available, therefore an emergency is declared in this Ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
